A pair of early 20th century German silver novelty boxes and covers in the form of a cock and hen pheasant, each with detachable head and engraved plumage, import marks London 1910 by Berthold Müller, lengths 34cm and 29cm (one with part of tail feather detached but present).

Condition Report

Cock pheasant - tip of tail broken off but present, would therefore need a repair. Small dent to front breast of the bird. Otherwise in generally good order with good detail to plumage. Good clear hallmarks. Hen pheasant - overall generally good condition. Tail feather is slightly misshapen and bent and has a small tear, but no significant damage or repair. Good detail to plumage. Good clear hallmarks. Total weight 1116.7g.
