A Royal Doulton Charles Wilkinson & Co stoneware whisky jug, early 20th century, transfer printed with 'Robert Burn's Cottage Ayr' against a buff ground, impressed factory mark to base, height 21cm, together with a Barrowfield Pottery 'Auld Lang Syne' flask, transfer printed with a tavern scene, a Royal Doulton Dewar's Whisky 'Micawber' flask, another Royal Doulton flask and a Passil Pottery 'Tennant's Beer' tankard (some faults).

Condition Report

1462. Burn's Cottage - lacking stopper, otherwise in good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Auld Lang Syne - handle broken in two places and visibly glued. Minor nibbled chipping to top rim edge. Uneven edge to footrim since manufacture. No stopper. Micawber - overall network of fine long craze lines to glaze, otherwise ok, small area of scratches to reverse. Plain Flask - small chip to handle terminal, no stopper. Tankard - three noticeable firing cracks to footrim and other manufacturing flaws including haircracks to rim circumference.
