A 19th century French ebonized four glass mantel clock with eight day movement striking on a bell via an outside countwheel, the backplate stamped 'Henry & Cie A Paris' and numbered '486', the signed circular white enamel dial with Roman numerals framed by a gilt metal foliate surround, the gilt metal pendulum relief decorated with a bust portrait of a gentleman wearing a plumed hat, the case with moulded plinth base, height 30cm, with a key.

Estimate: £50 - £70

Condition Report

1161. A nice, mid-19th century, French clock movement mounted in a 20th century wooden case. Case constructed with modern materials and not original to the mechanism. The French mechanism is in good condition as described in the catalogue and was probably originally from a 'portico' design clock. Both gong and striking trains appear to be running and operating correctly. Pendulum bob not properly secured to upper post of pendulum.

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
