A Royal Worcester porcelain cabinet plate, circa 1878, centrally painted with a robin amongst fruiting branches, within a gilt and turquoise rim decorated with five circular panels of insects, puce printed factory mark to base, diameter 23cm, together with seven other porcelain cabinet plates, including a similarly decorated Royal Worcester plate with a puce border, circa 1877, and two Copeland examples, each decorated with a still life study of fruit.

Estimate: £60 - £100

Condition Report

1469. Robin plate - the turquoise ground has a gilt speckled finish which is heavily scratched, some of the white 'jewels' to the rim edge are a little worn. Puce broken plate - some wear to gilt detail and scratching to puce border, light wear to enamels. Spode plate gilt dotted rim - wear and light surface scratches. Spode celadon ground - crazed. Berlin gilt trellis rim - overall scratching to gilt rim, minor wear to enamels. Copeland with apple and grapes - minor chip to footrim, light wear/rubbing. Copeland with peach - ok. Copeland with green rim - minor scratches to rim.
