A pair of Chinese blue and white porcelain bowls, 18th century, painted with figures in a fenced garden, diameter 13.2cm, a Chinese blanc-de-Chine crucifix, length 17.8cm, a gilt metal rimmed pale celadon glazed porcelain bowl, Song dynasty, diameter 10cm, a Korean blue and white circular water dropper, diameter 8.4cm, and a white glazed vase, moulded with three masks, height 13.1cm (some faults).

Condition Report

1243. Blue and white bowl 1 - 9cm x 2.5cm broken section of rim which has been re-glued. Also several small chips to rim. Blue and white bowl 2 - 4.5cm long hairline to rim and a small chip to rim at the source of the hairline. Otherwise good order. Celadon bowl - good condition. Tiny chip to footrim but of little significance. Gilt rim maybe masking damage, but impossible to tell. Light wear and surface scratches to glaze interior. White vase - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Blue and white water dropper - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. The footrim has a chip and bruise in manufacture. Crucifix - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs.
