A French Jacob Petit porcelain square perfume bottle, mid-19th century, the narrow neck above a body painted with four floral panels against a green and gilt decorated ground, above a pierced scroll gallery, raised on four dolphin moulded feet, blue printed factory mark to base, height 14cm (lacking stopper), together with a group of similar English and Continental decorative ceramics, including three Staffordshire two-handed baluster vases decorated with floral sprays against a blue ground (faults).

Condition Report

1512. Jacob Petit - missing section of pierced gilt gallery and glued repairs/small losses to remaining areas of gallery. Otherwise gilding and decoration good. 2 green ground footed stands - one generally ok with light wear. Other with visible glued repairs to rim and top of stem. Unmarked. 3 blue ground English vases - unmarked apart from pattern No. '1403'. One missing large section of rim and with cracks to handles. One with glued handles and crack to body. One with badly restored handle. Magenta ground English vase - unmarked. Small chip to rim, light wear. Pair blue ground square vases - unmarked. English. One badly restored. Other with large chip to foot and light wear. Flatback - typically crazed, generally ok. Cylindrical spill - scratches but ok. Green ground Continental vase - 'E' incised to base. Glued repair to rim and missing 2 sections of rim. Light wear, small chip to one handle.

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
