## LOT 1515

A Coalbrookdale type porcelain two-handed inkstand, 19th century, of rectangular form with canted corners, encrusted with flowers and foliage within gilt borders, centrally fitted with a circular jar and taperstick cover, length 27cm (two inkwells missing), together with a group of other English porcelain, the majority decorated with floral sprays against a green ground, including a jug and various plates (some faults).

## Condition Report

1515. Inkstand - unmarked. One handle restored. Losses and restoration to applied flowers and foliage. Matching jar with 2 restored areas to rim, losses to applied detail. Missing 2 inkwells (?) from surface apertures. Floral encrusted taperstick - unmarked. Restored rim and handle. Losses/chips. Green ground jug - unmarked. Base broken away and restored back with rivets. Some light wear. Pair of plates - red painted pattern No. 6119. Both crazed but ok. Green ground inkstand - wear to decoration but ok. Comes with one inkwell which is lacking cover and badly broken. Another similar inkwell lacking cover and cracked. Green ground spill - unmarked. Cracked, crazed and stained. Green ground mug - unmarked. Crazed. Light staining and wear. Pair plate - red pattern No. 2/3828. Worn but ok. Plate - red pattern No. 4546. Scratches but ok. Plate - gilt pattern No. 143. Crazed but ok. Leaf shaped dish - unmarked. Missing one handle and loss to rim. 2 tea plates - green ground. Unmarked. Worn but ok.
