A Mason's ironstone china 'Prunus Bush' pattern part dinner service, mid-19th century, decorated in the Imari palette with prunus branches within foliate borders, comprising five graduated oval platters, two large soup tureens and covers, soup ladle, two vegetable tureens and three covers, four small tureens and covers, two small ladles, three sauce boats, two two-handled serving dishes and a large serving bowl, some with red painted pattern No. '1701' to bases, serving bowl with black printed retailer's mark 'Higginbotham & Son Sackville Street Dublin' to base (some faults).

Condition Report

1486. Largest platter - crazed with light staining. 2 medium platters - badly crazed and stained with chips. 2 small platters - both crazed. One badly stained. 2 soup - both badly crazed with light staining, one cracked. Covers ok. Ladle - stained, crazed, glued repair. 2 vegetable tureens - both crazed. One with large chip to rim underside. Tiny chip to rim edge of one cover. 4 small tureens - crazed with light staining to 2 but generally ok. 2 small ladles - crazed but ok. 3 sauce boats - each crazed, one stained. 2 two-handled dishes - crazed and stained, one with chip. Bowl - crazed with light staining, wear to interior.
