A pair of Continental 'jewelled' opaline glass vases, in the style of Moser, late 19th/early 20th century, the cream coloured high shouldered bodies with a central band of alternating orange and green cabochons against a gilt band, heightened with turquoise enamelled or gilt ground foliate panels, detailed with small red glass 'jewels', the rims with further small red 'jewelled' detail, unmarked, height 20.5cm (wear).

Estimate: £70 - £100

Condition Report

1460. Fundamentally both vases are in good condition with no cracks, chips or restoration. There are varying degrees of wear to the gilt line detail around the feet, necks and rims - almost totally worn in places. Some of the larger green cabochons have possibly been re-applied and display minor flaws on close inspection. Otherwise typical light wear overall.

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
