A pair of Moore Bros porcelain white glazed comports, late 19th century, each naturalistic leaf bowl encrusted with flowering cactus, the stem similarly decorated, flanked by two cherubs forging arrows, one standing next to an anvil, the other next to a brazier, on an oval base, height 23cm, together with a Moore Brothers oil table lamp base, the globular reservoir encrusted with flowering cactus above a naturalistic stem, flanked by three cherubs, on a circular base, total height 53cm, later converted to electricity (faults).

Estimate: £50 - £80

Condition Report

1502. Pair comports - each bowl top very, very badly damaged and poorly restored/repared with old rivet holes. Subsequent losses. Main body of one comport with a number of cracks and with one cherub missing a wing. Oil lamp base - converted to electricity. oil reservoir with one glued flower and some losses/chips and a crack. main stem with cracks, discolouration and some losses, including one cherubs hand and at least one flower.
