A Chinese porcelain brush pot, mark of Qianlong and probably of the period, of cylindrical form, painted en grisaille with opposing mountainous landscape panels, signed Mo Fu, with black characters and red seals, reserved against a pale green ground incised with scrolling foliage, turquoise washed interior and footrim, underglaze iron red seal mark to base, height 9cm (restoration).

Estimate: £1,800 - £2,400

Condition Report

1161. Wear to gilt rim. The brush pot has had a large section broken out and re-glued with some overpainting. The section appears to have been a fairly clean break. The broken section is approx 14cm x 7.5cm.
