A large group of Clarice Cliff Bizarre Autumn Crocus pattern wares, 1930s, comprising two trios, four dessert bowls, two small plates, a tea plate, a saucer, two graduated circular bowls, an octagonal bowl and a grapefruit bowl, together with three pieces of Spring Crocus pattern, various printed, painted and impressed marks to bases (some minor faults and restoration).

Estimate: £200 - £300

Condition Report

1436. Octagonal bowl - purple and blue enamel re-touched. Otherwise ok. Large circular bowl - overall light surface scratches and inner rim yellow band completely worn. Small circular bowl - some areas of restoration to rim, inner rim yellow band re-painted, starcrack to base with some restoration. Tea plate - ok Saucer - crazed but ok. Four bowls - typical scratches and flaking but generally ok. Grapefruit - minor scratches to base interior. Two small plates - surface scratches and wear but ok. Two trios - plates marked 'Royal Staffordshire' - one crazed. Saucers ok. Restored haircrack to one cup. Spring crocus - cup and saucer marked 'Royal Staffordshire' - good condition. Cake plate is worn and scratched.
