## LOT 1072

A Chinese fuzhou (foochow) lacquer dish, early 20th century, modelled as a lotus leaf supported by an openwork cage of lotus stems enclosing a chilong clambering from beneath, length 7.5cm, together with a brown and gilt lacquer brush rest of scroll form, length 8cm, a lacquer circular box and cover, decorated with two fish, diameter 8cm, and a small group of other Oriental items. Provenance: from the estate of the late Nellie Lenson-Smith (1928-2017).

## Condition Report

1072. Lacquer leaf dish/stand - small chip to rim of leaf, otherwise good condition. Lacquer scroll shaped rest - good condition, some wear to gilt and lacquer. Lacquer circular box - good condition, typical light wear and surface scratches. Lacquered wood pumpkin - missing something it was attached to and small nicks and scratches. Poor quality snuff bottle - good condition, incorrect stopper. Hardstone figure - chipped and poor quality carving.
