LOT 1427

An English porcelain part service, possibly Coalport, early/mid-19th century, of fluted shape with blue striped decoration beneath gilt edged scalloped rims, comprising two muffin dishes and covers, two cake plates, a sugar bowl and cover, two graduated bowls, two graduated rectangular platters, seven breakfast cups and nine saucers, nine teacups and saucers, three coffee cups, twelve tea plates and one small plate, unmarked (some faults).

Condition Report

1427. Overall there is wear to the gilt (some heavy) on the high points and some overall light surface scratching. Muffin dishes and covers - one cover has had its finial visibly reglued, one dish has a small chip to the footrim. Cake plates - one has a couple of very small firing cracks to the rim. Smallest rectangular platter - a number of small nibbles to the rim, with some gilt retouching and a tiny flake chip to the border. Smallest bowl - approx 1.5cm chip to rim with associated hairline crack. Sugar bowl & cover - cover has had its finial visibly reglued. Small plate - heavily crazed. Tea plates - three with chips to interior rim, one with chip to underside of footrim. Coffee cups - one with minute nick to footrim. Teacups - one hairline cracked, one heavily crazed, one with chip to footrim. Saucers - one star cracked, one with faint hairline to centre, one with chip to rim.
