## LOT 528

A small group of piqué inlaid tortoiseshell jewellery, comprising a bangle of twin section form, a brooch, designed as a crescent enclosing a star, and a pair of pendant earrings, each formed as a row of three graduated beads, the tops with wire fittings, mostly last quarter of the 19th century.

## Condition Report

528. Bangle: the interior edges of the bangle are somewhat chipped in places. There is some loss of inlay of the central band at one end. One corner of one section badly chipped. Crescent brooch: there is a small chip to one end of the crescent. It is inlaid with the initials 'J S' at the back by the hook of the clasp, possibly John Stevens of Sheffield. The hinge of the clasp has been re-glued into position. Earrings: tortoiseshell is of a rather bleached appearance with some loss of inlay to the design principally to the larger beads of the tops.
