A George III silver cylindrical mustard with tappit hinged lid, the body pierced with foliate borders above a beaded rim, London 1782, possibly by Burrage Davenport, height 7cm, together with a similar silver cylindrical mustard, London 1782 maker's mark rubbed, height 7.5cm, and two matched silver condiment spoons.

Condition Report

370. Pierced - hallmarks to base good and clear apart from rubbed maker's mark which is not easily legible, hallmarks to underside of lid very rubbed. Top of lid with engraved monograms. Two tiny vertical splits to inner rim where handle joins. Glass liner badly cracked and with chip. Solid body - hallmarks quite rubbed. Good condition otherwise, engraved crest to top of lid and front of body. Two spoons - rubbed marks but ok.
