An early Victorian silver cylindrical mustard with tappit hinged lid, the body with foliate pierced decoration, London 1839 by Edward Aldridge I & Edward Aldridge II, height 6.8cm, together with a silver cylindrical mustard, London 1895 by Charles Stuart Harris, height 7.5cm, and two silver condiment spoons.

Condition Report

368. Aldridge mustard - good condition, nice clear hallmarks, engraved portrait bust crest to top of lid is visible but very worn. Harris mustard - good clear hallmarks, ever so slightly dented by handle which has solder repair. Vacant cartouche to front of mustard, engraved crest to top of lid. Scratches to underside of lid. Chip to inner edge of glass liner. Pair spoons - good clear hallmarks, bowls a tiny bit worn.
