A William IV silver pounce pot of baluster form, the pierced cover with knop finial above a frill cast shoulder and ribbed body, raised on a similarly decorated circular foot, London 1831 by Joseph Angell II, height 8.2cm, together with a small group of other silver and plated items, including a mustard, two candle snuffers, an octagonal silver salt, a silver and cut glass condiment bottle and two coffee spoons.

Condition Report

347. Pounce pot - in good condition overall, tiny dent to cover. Hallmarks rubbed but readable. Mustard - plated. In good condition. Two snuffers - plated. Visible seam to one, other with tiny dent. Both engraved with a squirrel. Salt - tiny split to stem. Date letter rubbed. Generally ok. Glass condiment - ok. Coffee spoons - one with quite worn bowl. Other ok.
