A Victorian coromandel vanity box, the hinged lid opening to reveal a compartmentalized interior, fitted with silver mounted glass jars, bottles and rectangular boxes, London 1878 possibly by Thomas Wheeler, and various mother-of-pearl handled accoutrements, above a single drawer to base, width 31.2cm.

## Condition Report

339. Overall generally good condition. The case has a split to the veneer across the top and two small splits to edges of top. Small area of veneer lifting near to base of one side. Some surface scratches to veneer and small section of brass banding missing to bottom front corner. All silver covers not plated. Glass jars and bottles in generally good condition. One rectangular box has a chip to rim, otherwise only very minor chips of no real significance. Silver covers are generally good with typical wear and all engraved with monogram. One of the covers on the bottles is a bit dented. Bottom drawer does not want to open. Mother-of-pearl penknife does not fit and one other accoutrement missing and replaced by another button hook.
