A Meissen porcelain Kakiemon style beaker and saucer, late 18th century, the saucer of five petalled flower shape, the beaker of gently swollen tapered cylindrical form, both enamelled with the Two Quail pattern heightened in gilding beneath chocolate brown rims, crossed swords and star marks in underglaze blue to bases, diameter of saucer 13cm, height of beaker 6.1cm. Note: a similar pair of beaker and saucers sold at Bonhams London, lot 39, 16th November 2005.

Estimate: £400 - £600

Condition Report

1512. In good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. There is very typical light wear to the enamels and gilding, nothing significant. There are 2 manufacturers firing cracks to the knotted section of the saucer rim, a minor glaze flake to the saucer well interior at the base of one red bud and a small unglazed spot of wear to the saucer well at 1 o'clock beneath the prunus blossom, another manufacturing issue and really nothing to worry about.
