## LOT 1081

A pair of Chinese blue and white porcelain cylindrical vases, mark of Kangxi but late 19th century, each painted with a mountainous lakeside landscape, underglaze blue four character mark to bases, height 20.5cm (chip to rim of one), together with a small group of Chinese blue and white export porcelain, Qianlong period, including a scallop shell shaped dish (some faults).

## Condition Report

1081. Pair - one with small chip to footrim, other with chip to neck rim. Caddy - replacement metal cover. Triangular shaped chip with vertical hairline to neck with smaller glaze chip alongside. Gilded detail completely worn. Tea bowl - two tiny nicks to rim. Shell - fritting to rim. Teapot - handle broken away at terminals and visibly glued with two associated hairlines radiating from lower terminal into body. Large chip to spout and another to rim. Air hole in cover drilled to accommodate chain. Gilding worn.
