A Chinese famille rose enameled porcelain bowl, mark of Xianfeng and possibly of the period, of flared octagonal form, the exterior alternately painted and gilt with figures and calligraphic panels, painted iron red seal mark to base, height 5.6cm, width 10.7cm (chips to footrim), together with a Chinese famille rose bowl, mark of Qianlong but late Qing dynasty, enamelled with Buddhistic lions and vapours, iron red printed seal mark to base, height 6cm, two famille rose tea bowls, another tea bowl and an hexagonal saucer.

## Condition Report

1059. Octagonal bowl - few minor chips to rim and chips to footrim. Minor wear to gilt. No cracks or repairs. Buddhistic lion cup - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Minor wear to enamels. Saucer - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Some wear to enamels. Mandarin palette famille rose tea bowl - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Some minor wear to decoration. Famille rose tea bowl - repaired chip to rim and hairline crack to rim. Imari tea bowl - chip to rim, otherwise fair condition, some wear to enamels.
