LOT 1451

A Masons Ironstone China Fence, Rock and Gold Flower pattern part service, early 19th century, comprising three graduated platters, a large tureen and cover, two smaller tureens, covers and stands, three soup bowls, twenty-two dinner plates, nine dessert bowls and twelve side plates, impressed factory mark to bases, width of largest platter 57cm.

Estimate: £200 - £400

Condition Report

1451. Largest platter - has overall crazing and some heavy staining particularly to the centre. Middle platter - has been rivet repaired on one of the shorter sides and broken and re-glued on one of the longer sides, it also has a hairline crack and has some staining to the centre, there is also some small areas of wear to the decoration, particularly on the leaves and blue areas. Smallest platter - rivet repaired and has a large chip to the rim where the rivet repair begins on one side. Dessert bowls - six fundamentally ok with varying degrees of wear to the decoration, particularly to the gilding, one is rivet repaired, two are hairline cracked. Side plates - all have some very heavy losses/wear to the gilding, most noticeable to the centres, three have chips to the rim edge. Soup bowl - all fundamentally ok, minor wear. Largest tureen - the cover has slight stained crazing to the interior, but very minor. The tureen has a couple of small firing cracks to the sides beside each handle. There are a couple of small chips to the footrim. Fundamentally ok. First small tureen, cover and stand - the tureen is hairline cracked and also has a couple of additional starcracks to the base. The cover has a fairly large wide chip to the inner rim edge and a couple of smaller chips opposite this. The stand has some minor wear. Second small tureen, cover and stand - fundamentally all ok, with only minor wear.
