Two rare French porcelain pot lids and bases, 19th century, both printed in black, the covers with gilt banding, the first titled 'Grasse d'Ours du Nord' above a bear, the base with a continuous view of bears in a landscape, the second titled 'Veritable Moele de Boeuf' above a bull, the base with a continuous view of cattle in a landscape, both covers marked 'PD' amidst print, incised marks to underside of bases, 5.4cm and 5.5cm high (minor faults).

Condition Report

Grasse d'Ours du Nord - lid in generally good condition. Some heavy losses to the gilding on front of lid, slightly less so to the sides. Minute glaze flake to exterior rim edge, but hardly noticeable. Pot in generally good condition. Minute chip to exterior edge and couple of minute nicks to top rim edge, though hardly noticeable. Veritable Moele de Boeuf - lid generally good condition. Some rubbing to title text on front and some heavy losses to gilding. Long flat chip, approx 1.5cm, to interior rim edge which is only partially visible to exterior, and a much smaller nibble to the left of this. Pot in generally good condition. Small surface loss of the transfer print below one of the bulls. Couple of minute nicks to top rim edge, though hardly noticeable.
