A set of three Chinese Nanking Cargo blue and white porcelain tea bowls and four matching saucers, Qianlong period, each painted with pine, saucer diameters 11.5cm, one bearing applied Nanking Cargo paper label to base, together with a Chinese Longquan celadon bowl, Song dynasty, diameter 15.4cm (chipped and cracked), a Chinese crackle glazed tea bowl, height 6cm, and three other pieces of Oriental ceramics (some faults).

Condition Report

1139. Nanking pieces: tea bowls - each rim extensively fritted: Saucers - each with fritting/small chips to rim and short haircrack to each rim. Celadon bowl - cracked and chipped. Tea bowl - 2 minor chips to footrim. Famille rose saucer - haircrack to rim, light wear. Satsuma brooch - glaze loss to approx half of blue outer edge. Dents to white metal back. Circular box and cover - small chip to rim of base.
