## LOT 1267

A Chinese famille noire porcelain double gourd shaped vase, 19th century, painted with blossoming prunus on a black ground, height 28.5cm (drilled to base and converted to a table lamp with gilt bronze mounts, detailed 'Robertsons Ltd 83 Knightsbridge London'), together with a Chinese famille rose enamelled porcelain cockerel, 20th century, height 35cm (repaired comb), and a pair of Chinese mustard yellow crackle glazed vases, height 20.5cm (converted to table lamps).

## Condition Report

1267. Famille noire - converted to lampbase so with applied mounts and drilled base - has not been inspected without mounts in situ. Five smallish areas of glaze loss to main body at widest point generally, otherwise in good condition with no chips, cracks or repairs. Cockerel - glued repair and minor glaze loss to comb, tiny nick to base edge. Pair - 19th century. Both converted to lampbases, therefore drilled to bases but not inspected without mounts in situ. One with small chip to base edge, some surface scratches. Wooden bases with losses and faults.
