A Chinese famille rose enamelled green ground porcelain bowl, mark of Qianlong, the exterior with pink and blue flowers on an incised green enamel ground, underglaze blue seal mark to base, diameter 14.3cm, and a collection of other Chinese porcelain, Kangxi period and later, including a famille verte teapot, a famille verte circular bowl, tea bowls and a famille rose cover, mark of Daoguang and of the period, painted with a continuous scene of figures in a landscape, iron red seal mark to top (faults).

Condition Report

1194. Green ground bowl - approx 3cm long hairline to base visible to interior and underside by mark. Approx 3cm long haircrack to rim. Incised or scratched flower to base interior - not original. Famille verte teapot - lacking handle, body badly cracked, small chips to spout. Figural bowl - broken into a number of pieces and held together with sellotape, chips to rim. Considerable wear overall. Blue and red teapot - missing spout. Yellow gourd vase - tiny chip to footrim. Cover - large chip and crack to rim. 2 coffee cups - one missing handle and with chip to rim. Other with replacement handle, cracks to body and chipped. Teacup - generally ok, gilt rim worn. 4 tea bowls - each cracked and/or chipped. Buddhistic lions - ok.
