A Chamberlains Worcester porcelain teapot and cover, circa 1786-1810, decorated with floral sprays, painted mark to interior of cover, height 16.5cm (restored), together with a group of 19th century teawares, including a Copeland & Garrett late Spode tobacco leaf pattern butter tub and cover, a Spode part tea service, decorated with floral borders against a deep claret ground, heightened in gilt, comprising two cake plates, slop bowl, milk jug, sixteen cups and tea saucers, and a Derby inkstandish, decorated in the Imari palette (faults).

Estimate: £120 - £180

Condition Report

Chamberlains teapot - spout repaired, filled chip to rim, some chips to edge of cover. Gilt Spode sucrier and cover - cover crazed with some chipping, typical light wear to gilding particularly on rim. Imari decorated jug - handle professionally restored. Imari two-handled sauce tureen and cover - cover badly broken and riveted, otherwise ok. Orange ground teapot and cover - replacement metal spout, handle repaired. Gilt decorated teapot - 2 significant cracks to body. Copeland & Garrett - ok, wear to rim where cover sits. Inkstand - stained crazing and riveted repairs. Teaset - 8 coffee cups; 2 cracked, 8 teacups; 3 with rivet repairs. Jug; ok, Slop bowl; ok. 2 square plates; light wear but ok. 10 saucers; overall gilding wear, 4 with faults.
