An early 20th century pollard oak bracket clock with eight day twin fusee movement striking quarters and hours on two bells, the gilt brass circular dial with foliate engraved matt centre, framed by black Roman hours, and inscribed 'James Murray & Co, Royal Exchange', the case with brass pineapple finial above a carved twin scroll pediment, applied with gilt rosettes and fluted columns, the panelled sides with brass foliate and loose ring handles, on a mounted plinth base and brass bun feet, height 42cm, with pendulum and case key.

Condition Report

1080. A clean movement that appears to be in working order but please be aware we give no guarantees to working order or reliability of any clock or watch. Case in good condition with no obvious damage. Front bezel/door hinge has been strained and now refuses to close fully. No signature to backplate. Please note that we believe the clock is probably an early 20th century example rather than the 'Victorian' stated in the catalogue, so a late James Murray clock.

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
