## Condition Report

Port label - some typical surface scratches. Engraved monogram to reverse. Good clear hallmarks. Some solder repairs to chain.  
Brandy label - typical light wear, good clear hallmarks. Bowl - one foot dented and very slightly pushed in. Splits to rim and dents to body. Napkin ring - quite dented, marks worn. Pepper - clear hallmarks. Good condition.
