A pair of English porcelain cachepot and stands, early 19th century, each painted with floral borders and gilt foliate panels, flanked by moulded loop handles, total height 12.5cm, together with a small group of 20th century porcelain, including a basket, decorated with a green and gilt border, and a Sèvres style inkstand, decorated with panels painted with exotic birds against a puce ground.

Condition Report

1464. Pair cachepot - in good condition overall with no chips, cracks or repairs. One has been used as it has limescale residue and more significant wear to the gilding where it slots in the stand. Otherwise there is typical wear to the gilding and enamels. Basket - in good condition overall, no chips, cracks or repairs. Signed 'E. Tipping'. Sevres style inkwell - lacking components, some minor craze lines and typical light wear to gilt rims. Green inkwell - matched cover, crack to body. Haircrack to cover which has glued stopper. Typical wear to gilding.
