A William Brownfield pottery 'Chiswick' pattern part dinner service, 19th century, comprising a tree and well platter, six graduated platters, two vegetable tureens and covers, two sauce tureens, covers and stands, a two-handed serving dish, twelve soup plates, twelve dinner plates and eleven side plates, printed mark to bases (minor faults).

## Condition Report

1427. General overall crazing. Staining to two of the graduated platters (largest and second smallest). Cover of one sauce tureen cracked, one stand stained. Two-handed serving dish - cracked. Dinner plates - five stained, three others stained and chipped to rim. Side plates - five stained and another with an old repaired chip, now discoloured. Soup plates - two with faint hairline cracks. Other pieces okay. All have strong colour and gilt decoration, with some light surface scratching.
