A George III silver three-piece tea set of cushion form, engraved with a crowned lion crest in an oval Greek key surround beneath a band of foliate and quatrefoil motifs, raised on ball feet, comprising teapot, two-handled sugar bowl and milk jug, London 1805 and 1806 by Charles Chesterman II, height of teapot 14cm, together with a matched silver teapot stand, London 1806 by Solomon Hougham, length 14.5cm.

368. Weight - 858.4g excluding stand. Overall in good condition. All pieces with engraved crest but no other inscriptions. No erasures. Teapot - good condition, no significant damage or repairs. Good clear hallmarks, finial a bit wobbly. Teapot stand - good condition, no significant damage or repairs. Good clear hallmarks. Milk jug - good condition, couple of very minor dents to body, good clear hallmarks. Sugar bowl - good condition, minor dent to body. Slightly rubbed marks.
