## LOT 1048

A Chinese export porcelain tea bowl and stand, Kangxi period, each of hexagonal outline, painted in iron red, green and gilt with a boy and lotus panels, underglaze blue mark to bases, total height 4.5cm, together with a small group of other Chinese export porcelain tea bowls and saucers, Yongzheng and Qianlong periods, with various floral, fish and deer decoration, and a famille rose export porcelain wine cup and stand, Yongzheng period, each piece painted with a boy within iron red, gilt and floral borders, total height 4cm (some with faults).

## Condition Report

1048. Hexagonal bowl and stand - few very minor chips to rims of both, otherwise good condition. Colours and gilt are good. Famille rose Buddha boy pattern cup and saucer - overall good condition, two tiny chips to rim of wine cup. Fish decorated bowl and stand - small chip to rim of bowl, small chip and 3 small hairlines to rim of stand. Famille rose bird and flowering branch pattern bowl and stand - good condition except for small hairline to rim of stand. Famille rose squirrel and leaves pattern bowl and stand - tea bowl in good condition, the stand/saucer has a 'V' section chip to rim with hairline crack and star crack to base. Imari saucer - 3 hairlines to rim and minor rim chips. Tea bowl with gilt deer - minor chip to rim, otherwise good condition. Goldfish decorated tea bowl - hairline crack to rim, otherwise good condition.
