A small group of Chinese blue and white porcelain wares, 18th century and later, including a small jar painted with an immortal and lengthy calligraphic text, underglaze blue six character mark of Chenghua to base, height 8cm, and a Chinese dragon medallion tea bowl, underglaze blue mark of Yongle but Qing dynasty, height 5.6cm.

Condition Report

1257. Jar - good condition, no cracks or restoration. Very minor rim fritting/glaze blemishes. Height 8cm, diameter 7cm. Circular dish - two 2.5cm hairlines to rim and two chips to rim (one ground down slightly). Height 3.7cm, diameter 11.4cm. Tea bowl with dragon roundels - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Height 5.7cm, diameter 8cm. Hexagonal pot - good condition. Height 7.2cm, width 8.2cm. Saucer - minor rim chips. Diameter 10.4cm. Octagonal pot - tiny chip to rim, otherwise good condition. 3.5cm, width 6.4cm. Circular box and cover - good condition. Height 3.3cm, diameter 7.8cm. Wine cup - hairline crack running from rim down to footrim and back up body in a 'U' shape. Height 4cm, diameter 6.2cm. Provenance - private Sussex collection.
