A group of nine Chinese Yixing stoneware teapots and covers, late Qing dynasty and later, including a buff ground teapot of bamboo form, incised with prunus branch and characters, impressed mark to lid interior, length 18.5cm, a blue enamelled teapot, impressed mark to base, length 16cm, a diminutive blue teapot and cover with overhead handle and lines or incised text, height 8.3cm, and a teapot of squat circular form, moulded in relief with prunus branches, length 20cm.

Condition Report

1140. All a bit dirty/dusty, so would benefit from a clean. Sand coloured teapot - few tiny chips to rim of cover, otherwise good condition. Dark brown teapot with articulated dragon head - small chip to inner rim, otherwise good condition. Mid brown teapot with bamboo moulding - good condition. Enamelled teapot - tiny repair to tip of spout, small chip to rim, otherwise good. Small blue teapot - good condition. Small brown teapot - good condition. Green teapot - good condition. Small pale brown teapot - good condition. Small black and brown teapot - good condition.
