A group of Chinese café-au-lait glazed porcelain teaware, Qianlong period, comprising a pair of fluted teabowls and saucers, height of teabowl 4.5cm, two globular teapots, each painted with opposing famille rose panels of birds and flowers, height 11.5cm and 12.3cm, five variously sized jars and two covers (some faults).

Condition Report

4054. Pair teabowls - both in good condition with no cracks, chips or restoration. One shows traces of gilding to exterior. One saucer has a small chip to the rim, otherwise both in good condition.

Smaller teapot - Glaze loss to finial of cover and small chip to rim of cover, otherwise in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Larger teapot - tiny chip to tip of spout, otherwise in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Matched cover with glaze loss to finial and approx 1.5 by 0.5cm chip to rim edge.

Jars - One with crack to rim, one cover with 3 chips to rim and glued break, otherwise all in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.
