A pair of pearlware bough pots, late 18th/early 19th century, of typical 'D' shape, each painted with three panels of fruit within moulded panels against a yellow ground, the rims with a grey and black circular band above green edge bases, unmarked, height 12cm (both restored), together with an associated bough pot cover with five circular apertures.

Condition Report

4177. Both with wear to grey lustre detail predominantly around panels, otherwise enamels in good order with typical light wear/surface scratches.

First - the whole of the base is covered in a yellowed restoration and spraying, it would appear to cover a chip to the front base edge and/or a crack running around the inner edge of the base - it encompasses spraying and minor re-painting to the green enamelled footrim and the very lower part of the panels - the overall appearance of this area could be improved greatly with professional modern day restoration and cleaning. Minor chip to reverse base edge and other minor chips to rim edges. Approx 3.5cm haircrack to base left corner.

Second - this bough pot has the same restoration issues as the first pot. In addition there are some minor chips to the rim edges. Crazed.

Pierced cover - only one available with the lot. In good condition with typical wear.
