A rare Staffordshire salt glazed stoneware teapot and cover, circa 1760, the globular body with crabstock handle, spout and finial, enamelled to one side with a titled portrait of the King of Prussia, to the reverse a crowned eagle with the motto 'Semper Sublimis', against an ermine ground which extends across the base and cover, unmarked, height 9.5cm (restored). Note: a similar example was sold at Bonhams, London, 18th April 2012, Lot 26.

Condition Report

4186. Cover extensively restored and repainted. Handle broken in at least 5 places with restoration and repainting overall and where joins body at upper terminal. Spout broken in at least 2 places and restored with restoration where it joins the body and extensive repainting overall. Some restoration to rim where cover sits with two small chips. Otherwise the main body is in good order with no damage to the panels and the enamels remain in good order.
