A gold mounted jade, diamond and enamelled brooch, circa 1920, the central jade panel carved and pierced with a butterfly amidst flowers, the surround with red and black enamelled decoration and diamond set scroll divisions, mounted with cushion shaped diamonds, width 6cm.

Estimate: £400 - £600

Condition Report

605. The jade is of a fairly green light even pastel shade with some darker hues to one butterfly wing. There is one sizable chip to the back of the jade and one or two hairline fractures. These are not detrimental to the front of the piece. The diamonds are old cut stones and look to be fairly white with one or two inclusions. The red and black enamel work is fairly chipped particularly so to the black. Weight 15.5g.

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
