LOT 1003

A Chinese copper, jade and enamelled hand mirror, late Qing dynasty, the mirror back inset with a celadon jade oval plaque, carved in low relief with Buddhistic emblems, within a pink enamelled surround, the handle mounted with a celadon jade belt hook, carved and pierced with chilong confronting a dragon head terminal, total length 22.5cm (some damage to enamel), with a case.

Estimate: £300 - £500

Condition Report

1003. Metal mounts in generally good condition with typical surface wear and slight misshaping to handle. Jade belt hook handle is metal mounted so impossible to check underside, but from what can be seen it is in generally good order, but does have a chip to one eye of the dragon's head.

Jade panel also looks to be in good condition with no apparent cracks or damage. The pink enamel surround has some hairline cracks and a chip above the handle. Pink enamel handle also chipped and cracked.

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
