LOT 410

An early Victorian silver four-piece tea set of tapering lobed form, decorated in relief with panels of grouse amongst grasses against a textured ground, raised on scallop shell and foliate feet, comprising teapot and hot water pot, each with a pheasant finial, two handled sugar bowl and milk jug, London 1843 by William Hunter, height of teapot 16.5cm.

Estimate: £400 - £600

Condition Report

410. Overall set in fair condition with typical light surface scratches, wear and some dents. Good clear hallmarks. Total weight 2285.36g.

Teapot - few dents to the body and spout. Repair to ring above feet, otherwise in generally good order. No significant damage or repairs.

Hot water pot - large dent to underside of spout and a few other smaller dents to body, otherwise generally good order.

Milk jug - few very minor dents, otherwise good condition.

Sugar bowl - numerous small dents to body. Feet are slightly misshapen/bent, otherwise ok with no significant damage or repairs.
