A Chinese hardwood mirror stand, late Qing dynasty, the carved and pierced four-panel back decorated with figures, fenghuang and flowers, each surmounted with carved dragon head crestings, framed by a carved and pierced gallery, the base fitted with three short and two long drawers, each front with carved lotus scroll decoration and brass handle, above a similarly carved frieze and scroll legs, height 65cm, width 53cm, depth 34cm.

Estimate: £4,000 - £6,000

Condition Report

1088. Overall generally good condition. One of the pair of second larger pierced panels has a small split to edge and some loss to pierced work. One of the pair of smaller panels also has some loss to pierced work. All drawers are slightly loose as runners are missing and one of the long drawers is missing its base panel. Also some typical minor losses and some minor re-gluing to loose joints.
