LOT 2100

A pair of early Victorian oak and walnut mounted marble topped side tables by Gillows of Lancaster, each black veined marble top above a single frieze drawer, bearing 'Gillow' stamp, raised on shaped supports and scrolling bracket feet united by fluted and reeded stretchers, terminating in brass castors, height 73cm, width 69cm, depth 46cm.

Estimate: £1,000 - £1,500

Condition Report

2100. One of the marble tops has a repair to one corner and the other top has an applied coat of some sort of varnish which would clearly need stripping off. There doesn't appear to be a reason for this varnish, as it is not covering up any restoration of any kind. One table has a section of trim missing to rear corner and some minor surface wear and small chips around the feed edges.

The other table is slightly faded and is missing a very small section of trim to the frieze. Similarly, the table has some typical surface wear and minor loss to the edges and scrolled sections on the feet, but otherwise both tables are in good order.

The darker sections are wrongly described as walnut and are in fact a darker figured oak. As quite heavy tables they need some level of support when moving but the castors work.
