A mixed group of Chinese pottery and porcelain, Qianlong period and later, including a famille rose plate with bianco-sopra-bianco rim, diameter 23.3cm, a blue and white export porcelain plate, diameter 23.2cm, and a diminutive teapot and cover, height 7.2cm, two celadon glazed Ming style dishes, diameters 15cm and 12.8cm, and a green crackle glazed vase, height 31cm (faults, repairs and restoration).

Condition Report

1042. Famille rose plate - 5cm hairline to rim and rim chips, some wear to enamels.

Blue and white plate - two repaired rim chips and other minor chips to rim.

Blue and white vase - restoration to rim and filled and painted crack to body.

Blue and white mini teapot - firing crack to handle, chip to rim and edge of cover, later metal mounted spout. Yixing teapot and pierced liner - chip to end of spout, two shallow chips to rim, otherwise body and liner in good order, missing cover.

Yixing teapot, liner and cover - few small chips to end of spout, otherwise body and handle in good condition. Liner also in good condition, cover missing finial.

Green crackled vase - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical surface wear and scratches. Seated dog - front leg broken in two places and badly repaired. Back left foot broken off completely and missing. Wear and scratches to glaze.

Small jardinière and stand - minor chips to rims and feet but no significant damage or repair. Typical surface wear to enamels and glaze.

Small celadon dish - badly worn and scratched glaze.

Old blue and white bowl - chips to rim and badly worn glaze.

Larger blue and white bowl - crack to rim and wear to glaze.

Shallow celadon dish - scratches to glaze interior, otherwise good condition.

Famille rose bowl - 2cm x 7cm hairlines to rim

Japanese Imari bowl - good condition

Famille rose tea bowl - good condition, tiny chip to rim.

Blue and white tea bowl - broken in half and re-glued.
