## LOT 277

A gold, diamond, ruby, emerald and blister pearl brooch, designed as a pheasant, claw set with the principal cushion shaped diamond to the beak, circa 1900, length 6.5cm (one rose cut diamond lacking).

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## Condition Report

277. The suggested age of the brooch is the first quarter of the 20th century. The principal diamond is drawing colour and has a few pique inclusions. There is some variation of cut of the rose diamonds (one rose diamond lacking). The rubies are of medium colour saturation. The emeralds are of pale colour saturation and have some internal inclusions. The blister pearl is in good condition. Weight 12.8g. This piece is unmarked but tests as approx 15ct.

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
