A pair of Sèvres style porcelain vases, late 19th century, each flared neck and tapering body painted with panels of exotic birds and putti within foliate gilt borders, flanked by brass mounted ram's head handles, height 33.5cm (one with restoration to base).

Condition Report

1533. First vase - extensive professional restoration to neck, at one point reaching down into parrot panel which includes some repainting. Similar professional restoration to foot - which has started to crack - it is difficult to determine what has happened here.

Second vase - two large areas of professional restoration to neck and similar restoration to foot.

Gilding on both feet rubbed.
