An extremely large Minton majolica urn, circa 1870, the turquoise glazed body applied with satyr masks alternating with pendants of fruit and leaves linked by ochre rope, raised on a pedestal foot and square base, pink glazed interior, height 95cm (faults).

Estimate: £5,000 - £7,000

Condition Report

1495. 6cm chip to inner rim edge. 2 indistinct vertical haircracks to interior running from mould lines/firing cracks to exterior. Section of blue strapwork repaired to side of one mask. Top of foot where joins to base of body extensively chipped all the way round hence vase wobbles slightly and has probable replacement fixing to base interior. Some chipping to square base and small chip to edge of circular foot. Some other very minor glaze chips but fundamentally the case is in pretty good order considering its size and age.
