LOT 1251

Two Chinese famille rose porcelain diminutive vases, Yongzheng period, one of beaker form, the other of baluster form, each painted with a pair of cockerels and peonies, heights 9.7cm and 8.7cm, together with a famille rose sparrow beak cream jug, Qianlong period, painted with figures and ox, height 10.4cm, and a pair of famille rose plates, painted with mandarin ducks on a lotus pond, diameter 23cm (one repaired).

Estimate: £60 - £100

Condition Report

1251. Famille rose baluster vase - faint hairline crack to rim (approx 1cm long) and only really noticeable under magnification, otherwise good condition.

Trumpet beaker vase - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs.

Cream jug - hairline crack (approx 2.5cm long) to rim, otherwise good condition.

Plate 1 - broken into 3 pieces and glued back together with some chip losses along the breaks.

Plate 2 - hairline crack to rim (4.5cm long).

Both plates have some wear to enamels, also glaze is a little smokey, possibly re-fired.
