An Edwardian silver mounted pocket watch holder in the form of a horseshoe, Birmingham 1908 by William Hutton & Sons Ltd, height 12cm, a silver diminutive novelty crumb scoop in the form of a dust pan, London 1897 by Hukin & Heath, length 10.5cm, a silver circular pin dish, the centre glazed with a print of five bloodhounds in a woodland scene, London 1907 by William Comyns, diameter 7.5cm, and a butt marker.

Condition Report

326. Silver horseshoe watch stand - silver in generally good order, but is missing five securing pins, has a few minor dents, typical light wear and surface scratches. Good clear hallmarks. Green velvet back is worn. Oak back in good order.

Dust pan - good condition with typical light wear and surface scratches. Good clear marks.

Circular pin dish - slightly misshapen rim with a few small dents. Marks slightly rubbed, but still good. Print is slightly stained.

Butt marker - length 6.5cm x 3.1cm. The case and pegs are both silver. The case has a part mark with lion passant and a 'W' (possibly for Birmingham 1921) to top of cover. The underside of case has a very rubbed, but still visible, 'E.S.B.' maker's mark for Edward S. Barnsley & Co. No other marks present or visible. Pegs are also silver, but are only marked 'SIL' so probably later replacements. These pegs also have very amateurish black numbering. Case has wear to engine turning and some surface scratches.
